







Mean NAPLEX Pass Rate for First-Time Attempts




FIRST-TIME PASS RATES ON NAPLEX, MPJE






NAPLEX PERFORMANCE: 3-YEAR TREND

MPJE PERFORMANCE: 3-YEAR TREND







DOCTORAL DEGREE PROGRAM


- PhD Program in Pharmaceutical Sciences was approved by THECB on July 25, 2019
- Inaugural cohort will be enrolled in Spring 2020 at Kingsville and College Station under a 'one program, two campus' model
- First of its kind model following FDA Critical Path Initiative
- Students will design and conduct research, have hands-on experience at research centers and laboratories, and complete a dissertation
